Keynote Speakers



Ali M. Kutan is a Distinguished Research Professor of Economics and Finance at Southern Illinois University at Edwardsville. He received his Ph.D. in Economics from Arizona State University. His research interests include international finance, financial markets and institutions, and financial aspects of economic development. His recent work focuses on emerging economies, including China. His

research is supported through several agencies, including The British Council, The National Council for Eurasian and East European Research, the U.S. Department of Education, and the William Davidson of Institute of the University of Michigan Business School. He was a visiting scholar at the Economic Research Department of the Federal Reserve Bank of St. Louis.

He served as a consultant to the World Bank, Asian Development Bank, US Commerce Department, and private companies. He has published extensively in over 150 peer review economics and finance journals. He is currently the managing editor of Emerging Markets Finance and Trade and Borsa Istanbul Review, and the co-editor of Economic Systems. In addition, he is an associate editor of International Review of Financial Analysis and senior editor of International Journal of Emerging Markets.

Wenxuan Hou (Wen) is Chair in Corporate Finance at the University of Edinburgh Business School and Special-term Professor at Shanghai Lixin University of Accounting and Finance. He is elected as a Young Academy Member of the Royal Society of Edinburgh (Scotland's national academy) and the president of China Economic Association (UK/Europe).

Wen has served as a Section Editor, Associate Editor or Guest Editor of Journal of International Financial Markets, Institutions & Money, European Journal of Finance, Finance Research Letters, Abacus, Corporate Governance: An International Review, International Small Business Journal, Pacific-Basin Finance Journal, and Journal of Business Ethics. His research interests cover corporate finance and governance, legal institutions and financial markets. He published 40 articles in FT50, ABS-4 and 3* journals, five books with Palgrave Macmillan, including publications in European Journal of Operation Research, Journal of Business Ethics, Business History, Abacus, Auditing: A Journal of Practice & Theory, British Accounting Review, Corporate Governance: An International Review, European Journal of Finance, International Review of Financial Analysis, International Small Business Journal, Journal of Business Research, Journal of International Financial Market, Institutions & Money and Regional Studies among others.

Wen received his PhD from Manchester Business School and pursued executive education at Kellogg School of Management. He was at Durham University until he joined Edinburgh in 2012. He taught a range of courses including Corporate Governance (MSc and executive), Corporate Finance (UG), Advanced Finance Theory (MSc) and Business Finance (MBA), and received multiple Best Teaching Awards and Excellent Contribution Awards.
